A MESSAGE FROM DEACON DAN GOSHEY

May the peace of the Lord be with you always

Can a person be busy and still be guilty of sloth?

I have a friend in another part of the country who volunteers in a variety of ways. He referees basketball games in his local school, is a member of the Knights of Columbus and at least one other service organization. He helps at the food shelf, church functions and in many other ways in the community. He is a reader at church and serves on various church committees. It seems he has something going on and is out of the house helping others almost every single evening. Whenever I greet him and ask how he is doing, he always responds the same way. "Busy!" But is that a good thing? Could he be guilty of the sin of sloth?

Sloth isn't simply laziness. The description I just painted of my friend is not a description of a lazy person. It is a description of a person who has filled his life doing good charitable works for others. But I ask you again, could he be guilty of sloth?

A good definition of the sin of sloth is "a failure to do those things that one is supposed to do." What if I told you that the friend I just described is married and has kids at home? What if I told you that his wife is stressed because all the work in the home is left to her? What if I told you that he doesn't spend much time with his kids, and they don't really know what it is like to have a dad present and attentive to them? That paints a different picture, doesn't it?

Many of us busy our lives doing good and helpful things. As a deacon, I have been known to have a very full schedule teaching, serving, counseling etc., all of which are good things. The question becomes this: Are we doing what God is asking us to do? Are we present to our family and nurturing our children? Are we engaged in our marriage and making time for one another? If a person is volunteering and busying himself or herself with serving others while neglecting his or her family, that person is probably guilty of sloth.

If God is calling me to spend an hour with Him in the Adoration Chapel every Tuesday, but I commit myself to volunteering at the soup kitchen – I may be guilty of sloth. If God is asking me to become a deacon, but I fill my days with working extra hours to bolster my income – or even if I am committed to prison ministry, and I have no time for discerning the diaconate – I may be guilty of sloth.

Sloth isn't about laziness. It is about filling your time doing things that God has **NOT** asked you to do (even if they are wonderful and generous things) and avoiding those things that He **IS** asking of you.

It might be helpful to spend some time pondering that. Ask God what He wants you to be spending your time on. Ask your friends and family whether they see you as busy... or present. Ask your spouse and your kids whether they feel you spend enough time with them. These are good questions to ask from time to time. The answers can help you make better choices, if needed. And a life lived doing God's will is a wonderful and beautiful life.




