A MESSAGE FROM DEACON DAN GOSHEY

May the peace of the Lord be with you always

One of the things I love about Christmastime is how we see God connect with different people in the way that works for them. Just a few examples:

Shepherds were uneducated and the lowliest of the population.

They were unlikely to know scripture well and probably were not very familiar with the prophecy of the coming of the Messiah. God came to them by providing an incredible and extravagant sight – an angel appearing – a multitude of angels in fact. They could see them fill the night sky and they could hear them sing! They needed something incredible to happen to recognize God speaking to them. Then the angels specifically told them exactly where to go and what to look for: an infant wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger. It was with an awesome display and experience that the shepherds were told about the newborn king. Speaking of kings, what about them?

The three (or however many there were) kings or wisemen or magi were astronomers. They were scientists of a sort. They were well educated, and they studied the stars. To them, an astronomical sign was given to tell them a new king was born and where to go and how to find him. We hear nothing in scripture that indicates they were contacted by an angel, either awake or in a dream. God showed them the signs in the way they could read them. Then there was Simeon and Anna.

Simeon was "righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel." He knew scripture and knew what to look for in the coming of the Messiah. God had told him he would see the Messiah before he died. Could it be that Simeon knew Mary and knew of her holiness and of her vow of perpetual virginity? Maybe when he saw her come into the temple carrying her baby, he knew what he was seeing – a virgin who bore a Son! And the prophetess, Anna, we are told, never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. She was close to the Lord, and she too recognized the virgin birth. Simeon and Anna understood because of their deep spiritual life.

In each circumstance, God communicated in a different way – they way the recipient needed. What about you and me? How is God speaking to us? What is God asking of us? What does he want to show us? How do we hear Him? It's going to be different for each of us. There are two things we can do to be more disposed to hearing Him.

One is to read scripture regularly. Scripture is God's word. He speaks to us on every page. Read scripture and ponder it in your heart. I might suggest that you don't make it a goal to get through the scriptures. Rather, ask God to let the scriptures **get through to you**.

The second way we can be more disposed to hearing God's voice in our lives is through prayerful silence. Set aside a predetermined amount of time to pray each day. Ten minutes? Thirty minutes? An hour? More? Start small and be consistent. Consider it an important appointment that you must keep – and honor it as such. Then, show up every day, and then quiet your mind. Prayer isn't about you speaking (even in your mind) as much as it is listening. Tell God you love Him. Thank Him for His many gifts in Your life. Then...listen. It may take some time, but if you form this habit, you will begin to recognize God's voice in your heart. You will also realize how near He is... not far off... but right there next to you... rejoicing that you desire to be with Him.


