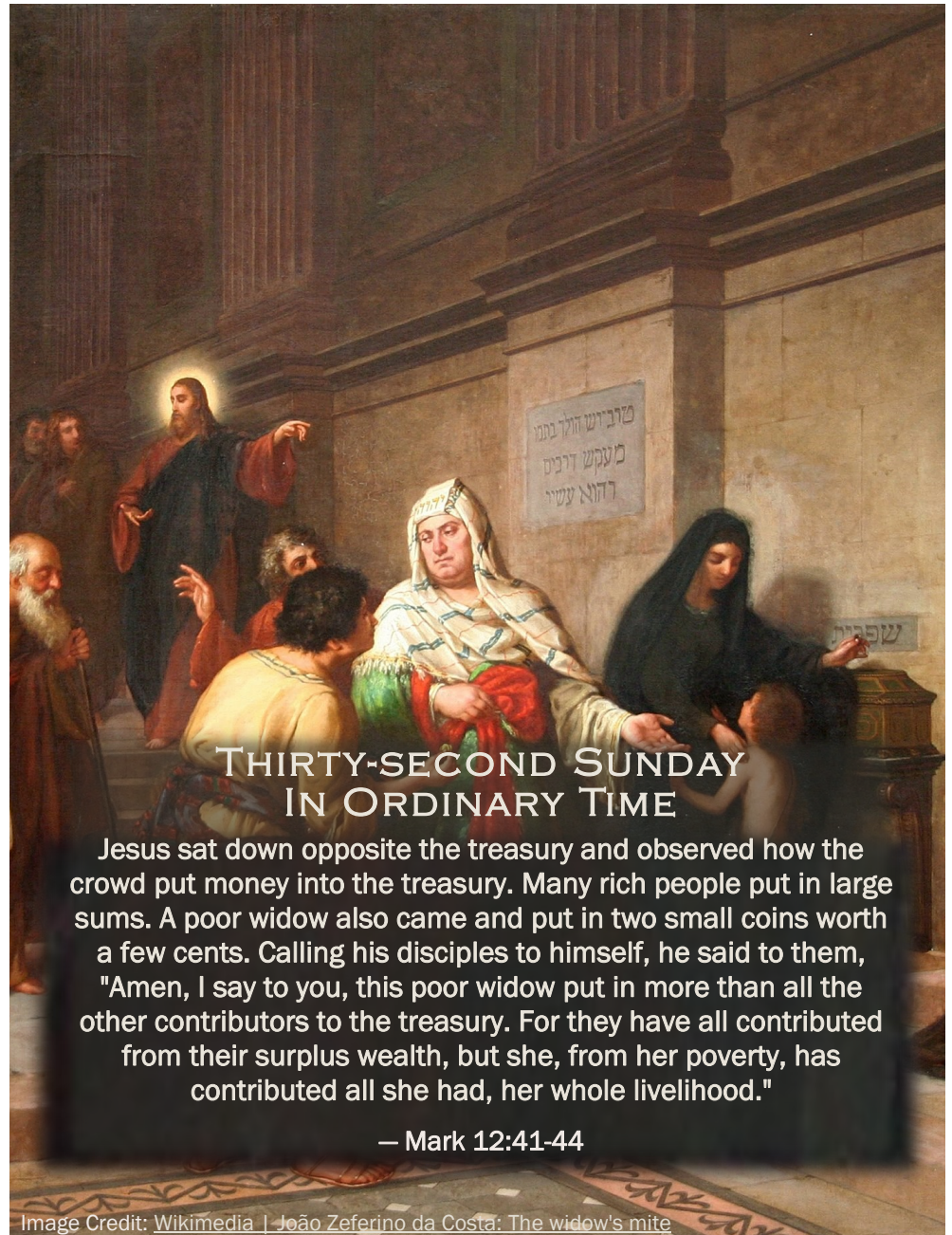

A MESSAGE FROM OUR SHEPHERD

As Church, we remember in a particular way during the month of November our loved ones who have passed from this life, and we pray for them and all souls, that they may know the Kingdom of God. As Christians, we believe that prayer is powerful - not only for those who are praying but also for the recipient of our prayers. In praying for others, they are blessed. We can have a great impact in relation to their journey to the Kingdom.

During the past several years, there have been fewer funeral Masses for people who have died in our community. Many families are choosing not to have a funeral Mass for their deceased loved ones. Though they often mean well, family members choose, for a variety of reasons, to offer a celebration of life, a simple burial service, or nothing at all rather than a funeral Mass. As Catholics, we must remember that the Mass is the most powerful prayer. Through the Mass, we commend our loved ones to God, offering them in union with Jesus, who suffered, died, was buried, and rose on the third day. The funeral Mass renews our faith in Christ and provides us with the sacred space to grieve with hope. Primarily, the

offering of the funeral Mass provides a grace-filled gift to our deceased loved ones. In helping to place them in union with Jesus, through the most efficacious place of offering that God instituted (namely, the Mass), we pray that they may realize the hope of life beyond the grave that Jesus revealed through His passion, death, and resurrection.

We are providing a **Funeral Mass Planning workshop on Saturday, November 16 at 9:00am at St. Joseph's, in the social hall.**

Though it may not be your favorite thing to plan, it is very important. When we plan for a funeral Mass, it helps to inform our loved ones about our desire to have a funeral Mass. Among other things, we will look at funeral reading options, music selections, and how to communicate with family members to ensure you will have a funeral Mass at the time of your passing. This workshop is open to all Catholics of our region.

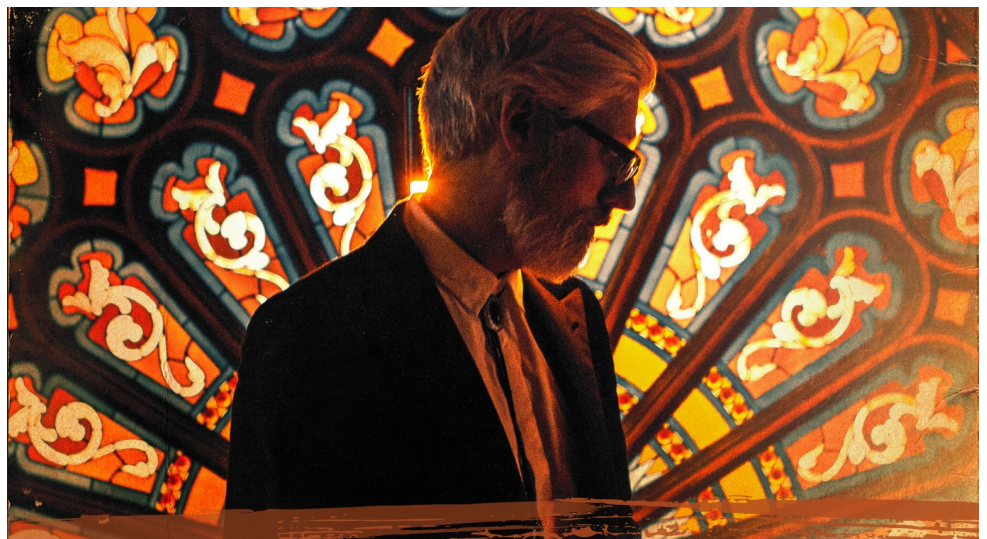
